ABOUT THIS REPORT

The following tables represent the annual performance report information included in the Program Year 2016 (State Fiscal Year 2017) Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Statewide and Local Performance Reports that were submitted to the U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) on October 16, 2017.

As part of the transition to the WIOA program, USDOL guidance for the Program Year 2016 annual report requires only the submission of the attached WIOA Title I performance information, and contains no requirements for the submission of a narrative report. Hence, no narrative report is included in this report. It is expected that that a narrative report will be included in the USDOL guidance for the Program Year 2017 annual report.

Additionally, in the past the annual performance report information has included a benchmark report. The Illinois Workforce Innovation Board Act (Public Act 100-0477) requires the board to determine the appropriate measures to consider in a benchmark report.
