



# Illinois Works Jobs Program





- An expansion of apprenticeship opportunities will help boost employment and wages for more Illinois residents. It will also yield significant benefits for our economy at large since the construction sector is projected to grow 12% in the next ten years.
- Investments in job training in the construction industry result in significant long-term economic impact totaling \$1.2 billion.
- For every dollar invested in construction job training, Illinois obtains \$11 in social and economic returns.



# **ILW Apprenticeship Initiative Summary**



For applicable projects, the goal is for the U.S. Department of Labor certified apprentices (not limited to pre-apprentice program graduates) to perform: 10% of total labor hours actually worked in each prevailing wage category or 10% of the estimated labor hours in each prevailing wage category, whichever is less.

# **Apprenticeship Initiative**



- ➤ The Apprenticeship Initiative launched in June of 2020 and is presently overseeing the implementation of over **800 Projects** worth over **\$8 billion**.
- We launched a new system that allowed us to transition from a manual quarterly reporting system to a real reporting system that utilizes Smartsheet. This is a compliance management platform.






In summary, the program provides:

- Preference to underrepresented populations that have historically encountered barriers to entry or advancement in public works trades, including minorities, women and veterans.
- > Free Tuition and a stipend to participants who attend the program.
- ➤ A comprehensive array of supportive services delivered to help address systemic barriers which prevent underrepresented populations from entering the construction industry.
- ➤ Generous funding at an average of \$11,000 per participant. ILW has a \$25 million annual appropriation to fund our grantees.






# **ILW Heat Map**

# Illinois Works Bid Credit Program



The **Illinois Works Bid Credit Program** incentivizes contractors to hire and retain a diverse pool of candidates. It allows contractors and subcontractors to earn bid credits by employing apprentices who have completed the Illinois Works Pre-apprenticeship Program. Bid credits can be used toward future bids for public works projects contracted by the State of Illinois or an agency of the state.



# Illinois Works Bid Credit Program Summary

In summary, the program provides:



- The Illinois Works Bid Credit Program allows contractors and subcontractors to earn bid credits for use toward future bids for public works projects contracted by the state or an agency of the state.
- Bid credits can only be earned for employing apprentices who have completed the Illinois Works Pre-apprenticeship Program but they can be earned for any project the graduate works.
- DCEO will establish the bid credit earning rate for all prevailing wage construction trades once the program rules are approved. This rate will be reviewed and revised annually.
- There is no maximum for bid credits that can be earned by contractors and/or subcontractors and no limit to the number of ILW Pre-apprenticeship graduates they can hire. **The Illinois Works Bid Credit Bank** is administered by DCEO as mechanism for tracking the bid credits.
- Bid credits can be pooled between multiple contractors and/or subcontractors for a single capital funded projects but there will have a maximum allowable bid credit amount for each project based on the estimated project cost.

Illinois Works recently launched the Career Services Team, designed specifically to:


- Build relationships with DOL RAPs.

- Create and provide customized lists of graduates.
- Provide long-term transition support to graduates.

The main goal of Illinois Works is to increase the number of Illinois Works pre-apprentices gaining employment and entry into the DOL RAPs of their choice.



# Connecting to Illinois Works Graduates – Job Matching

- The **Illinois Works Career Service Team** facilitates job matching. This highly effective team works hard to ensure a seamless and efficient process.
- Contractor's, only need to submit a job order though the Illinois Works Employer Form and specify their employment needs.
- This user-friendly form allows the Illinois Works Career Services Team to send a list of Illinois Works graduates that match their job requirements.
- The job order form is also used by contractors to provide follow-up information about the graduates they might have screened or hired from the list they received.

# **NOFO Goal**



The **goal** of the Illinois Works Pre-apprenticeship Program NOFO is to provide grants to community-based organizations (including accredited public colleges or universities) or coalitions throughout the State that will recruit, prescreen, and provide pre- apprenticeship skills training, and transition participants to U.S. Department of Labor (US DOL) Registered Apprenticeship Programs.

Successful grantees will be expected to provide pathways and manage the transition from the pre-apprenticeship program to a DOL-registered apprenticeship program (the Primary Goal of Illinois Works) in construction and the building trades.



### Grant Accountability and Transparency Act

The Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (GATA), 30 ILCS 708/I et seq., is landmark legislation that will increase accountability and transparency in the use of grant funds while reducing the administrative burden on both State agencies and grantees through adoption of the federal grant guidance and regulations codified at 2 CFR Part 200 (Uniform Requirements). Pursuant to the Act, the Grant Accountability and Transparency Unit (GATU) has been established in the Governor's Office of Management and Budget. GATU is charged with implementation of the Act in coordination with State grant-making agencies and grantees. The following links provide a diffect connection to:



### **Background**

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (the "Department" or "DCEO") is issuing this Notice of Funding Opportunity ("NOFO") to expand the Illinois Works Pre-apprenticeship Program. The Illinois Works Pre-Apprenticeship Program is administered by the Department's Office of Illinois Works.

The goal of the Illinois Works Act is to ensure that all Illinois residents have access to State capital projects and careers in the construction industry and building trades, as well as provide contracting and employment



### **Program Design**



The Illinois Works Pre-apprenticeship Program provides grants to community-based organizations (including an accredited public college or university) or coalitions throughout the State that will recruit, prescreen, provide pre-apprenticeship skills training, and transition participants to U.S. Department of Labor (US DOL) Registered Apprenticeship Programs. Successful grantees are expected to provide pathways and manage the transition from the pre-apprenticeship program to a full apprenticeship program in construction and the building trades.
