PROGRAM GOAL

The Climate Works Pre-apprenticeship Program is a FREE training program designed to prepare people to enter an apprenticeship program and build a career in construction, the building trades, and clean energy.

ELIGIBILITY

- Be 16 or older
- Reside in an equity investment-eligible community OR be formerly incarcerated OR be a current or former graduate of the foster care system.
- Have a high school diploma or GED/HiSET or be in a program to get one.
- Have an interest in a career in construction and building trades and clean energy.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Support services, based on participant need, may include:

- Childcare/family care
- Transportation assistance
- Driver education fees
- Math and reading tutoring
- Housing assistance
- Mental health counseling

- Basic safety/OSHA 10
- First Aid/CPR
- Introduction to construction math
- Introduction to hand tools
- Introduction to power tools
- Introduction to construction drawings
- Introduction to basic rigging

- Work-based learning
