Chicago Women in Trades



Chicago Women In Trades is a nonprofit organization that focuses on equipping women who desire a non-traditional career path in the construction trades with the tools needed to succeed. Their mission is "to ensure that all women who want to work with their hands and earn a good living have equal access to information, training, and employment opportunities in the industry." By providing these key resources, Chicago Women In Trades helps bring equity and inclusion to the talent pipeline of construction trade workers.

Chicago Women In Trades offers three free training program options. These programs are designed to prepare participants to take apprenticeship program entrance exams. The Women Build Illinois Program provides an overview of a variety of construction trades to



explore available career options. Participants are prepared for skilled trade apprenticeships upon completion of this 10-week/280-hour North America's Building Trades Union (NABTU) accredited Pre-Apprenticeship Program. Chicago Women In Trades has two additional 10-week training programs that take a deeper dive into apprenticeship preparation. Technical Opportunities Program is a 12-week/180-hour program where graduates gain basic construction skills and hands-on training. The Women in Welding Program is 10 weeks/288 hours and includes both OSHA 10 Certification and American Welding Society credentials.

The Chicago Women in Trades has successfully graduated its third cohort from the IL Works Pre-Apprenticeship program which brings the graduate total to 135 since they started the program in 2022. These IL Works Pre-Apprenticeship Graduates are educated, trained, and ready to be hired and enter a DOL Registered Apprenticeship Program.

She has an amazing support system at home to help her with the unpredictable hours and travel required for the construction world and cannot wait to get her boots on the ground and start working towards her goal of becoming a journeyperson.
