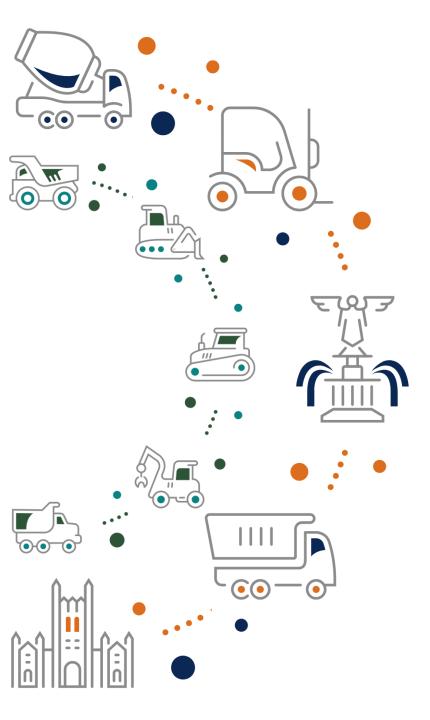

Application

Goals for the Application

- 1. Determine eligibility
- 2. Gather detailed demographic and employment data
- Evaluate if the participant needs any additional support or counseling around specific issues (re: criminal background, driver's licenses, drug use etc.)





Pre-apprenticeship Training Program Interview Questionnaire

Each participant interview should be conducted by two program representatives who must independently score the applicant's responses. Interviewers should take detailed notes regarding the applicant's responses. Once the interviewers have completed their questionnaires and scored the applicant's answers, the total scores from both interviewers should be averaged. An average score of 40 (100%) is the maximum score a participant can receive,

while the minimum score for acceptance to the program is 32 (80%). Once the final score has been calculated, it should be entered into the Illinois Works Reporting System (ILWRS) along with scanned copies of both questionnaires. Applicant interviews usually last 45 - 60 minutes. Time should be allocated for interviewer questions as well as a dedicated time for the applicant to ask questions.

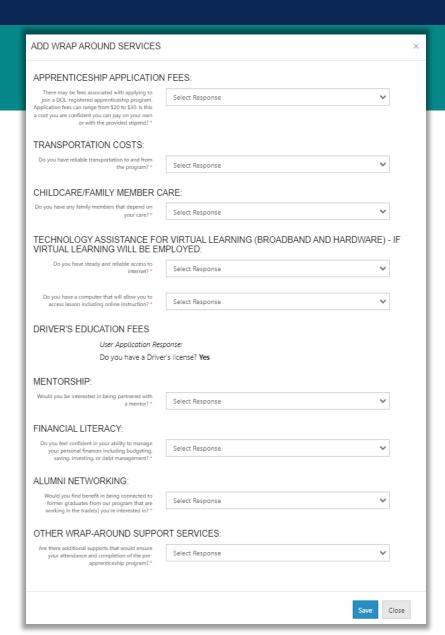

Interview

Goals of the interview

- 1. Build rapport with the participant
- 2. Determine the long-term goals of the participant and if ILWPP will help them achieve those goals
- 3. Evaluate if it is realistic for them to attend the program (i.e. timing and/or location of instruction, ability to meet the attendance requirements etc.)





Wrap-around Service Assessment

Goal of the Wrap-around Service (WAS) Assessment

1. Offer available services to participants to reduce or eliminate barriers to their program success

2024 Wrap-around Service Assessment Updates

The following services will be re-categorized as Transition Services:

- Apprenticeship Application Fees
- Alumni Networking
- Mentoring

All of these may still happen during instruction, but they will be removed from the WAS assessment and will need to be added to Transition Service goal manually

Orientation Career Assessment

Goals of the Orientation Career Assessment

- 1. Evaluate the participant for career readiness (i.e. update resume, interview experience, transition plan)
- 2. Determine career goals
- 3. Determine trade(s) of interest allowing the Transition Service Coordinator to activate partner networks to connect that participant with their trade(s) of interest through site visits, one-on-one connections, mentoring, alumni networking, etc.
