Illinois Works Program Goals:

- Provide a career pathway for residents in disadvantaged communities.
- Provide eligible apprentices with the skills for lifelong job security.

Illinois Works Apprenticeship Initiative Summary



The Illinois Works Apprenticeship Initiative opens doors of opportunity into the construction industry and the trades. It applies to public works projects with an estimated cost of \$500,000 or more, including both capital grants and direct capital contracts and awards.

The goal is for U.S. Department of Labor certified apprentices to perform:

10% of total labor hours actually worked in each prevailing wage category

or

➤ 10% of the estimated labor hours in each prevailing wage category, whichever is less.





Agency Responsibilities

Determine if the Apprenticeship Goal might apply to the project.

Ensure the grantee/contractor completes the Budget Supplement.

Monitor grantee/contractor compliance with apprenticeship goals.

Review Waiver/Reduction Requests.

Upon completion of the grant/contract, collect certification and submit it to DCEO Illinois Works Office.



Illinois Works Pre-Apprenticeship Program Summary





- > **Pre-apprenticeship skills training** through a network of community-based organizations.
- Preference to underrepresented populations that have historically encountered barriers to entry or advancement in the trades.
- > Free Tuition and a stipend to participants who attend the program.
- \$25M appropriated Illinois Works Funds for the grant program.





- Announcement of grantees in January of 2022
- 22 Grantees
- 23 grants
- Average award of \$417,000
- ➤ \$9.6 million investment
- Serving 1,030 Illinois Residents



Illinois Works Reporting System (IWRS)












IWRS Program Completion



Illinois Works Bid Credit Program



The **Illinois Works Bid Credit Program** incentivizes contractors to hire and retain a diverse pool of candidates. It allows contractors and subcontractors to earn bid credits by employing apprentices who have completed the Illinois Works Pre-apprenticeship Program. Bid credits can be used toward future bids for public works projects contracted by the State of Illinois or an agency of the state.







Illinois Works Bid Credit Program Summary

In summary, the program provides:



- The **Illinois Works Bid Credit Program** allows contractors and subcontractors to earn bid credits for use toward future bids.
- ➤ **Bid credits can only be earned** for employing apprentices who have completed the Illinois Works Pre-apprenticeship Program on public works projects contracted by state agencies.
- **DCEO will determine the bid credit** earning rate by rule. The rate will be published and may include maximum bid credits allowed per contractor, per subcontractor, per apprentice, per bid, or per year.
- The **Illinois Works Bid Credit Bank** will be established and administered by DCEO. DCEO is developing a mechanism for tracking the bid credits.





Integration of Three Illinois Works Programs: Applicant Tracking System



- Contractors needing to comply with 10% Apprenticeship Goal will come to the Applicant Tracking System to look for qualified candidates to hire and sponsor into DOL-registered apprenticeship programs
- Illinois Works Pre-Apprenticeship Program grantees will enter the profile of their graduates and upload an updated resume (they are responsible for keeping the information current)
- Contractors that join the Bid Credit Program will come to the Applicant Tracking System to look for qualified candidates to hire and sponsor into DOL-registered apprenticeship programs so they can earn bid credits





Applicant Tracking System: Training and Technical Assistance



- We will deliver one or two webinars to train grantee staff on using the platform.
- We will provide job aids for the different functions of the system.
- We will provide technical assistance for programs as they use the system and need more training or experience technological challenges.





Applicant Tracking System: Key Roles



- ➤ Illinois Works Staff: 1. Keep platform operational and update based on feedback and recommendations from grantees and employers. 2. Respond to contractor requests for graduates and match employers with grantees.
- Employers/Contractors: 1. Request graduates based on their job openings and geographic needs. 2. Update profile of grantee with interview and hiring information.
- ➤ **Grantees:** 1. Enter graduate's profile and updated resume. 2. Continuously update graduate's information and status (this requires constant communication with graduates)


